I. National Dissemination Meeting – Tom Hall and Gina Firth

- 3 Tiers of funding:
 1. Exemplatory - \$150,000 for 18 months
 2. Effective - \$150,000 for 18 months
 3. Promising \$100,000 for 18 months
- Programs must be in place for at least 2 years. There must be total program reporting.
- Programs must be experimental in design and there must be pre and post data. An enhancement plan must also be included. The programs and funding will closely follow the NIAAA 3in1 Framework. A site visit will be required as part of the grant and there will be NO funding for model programs.
- “Experiences in Effective Prevention” is a good resource for planning for this program. It can be found on the Network Website
- 5 Schools will be funded national. Applications are available April 4th and the deadline for submission is May 19th.

II. Elections – Jessica Carter

- Bob Ruday – current Chair will be resigning as of May 2008 from FHE-ASAP. Chair Elect – Christine Franzetti – will assume the Chair position until May 2010 per Bylaw instruction. A new Chair – Elect will need to be selected.
- From Bylaws: “The Chair Elect must be an active member of the FHE-ASAP and must have served a minimum of one year on the Executive Committee”
- Nominations – Tavis Glassman from UF and Tom Hall from UCF. Tom has deferred his nomination to Tavis Glassman. Tavis has accepted and is now the Chair Elect and will assume the Chair position in May 2010.

III. SARG update – Jessica Carter

- The Prevention Systems meeting hosted by DCF was held in late February and established FHEASAP's involvement in the SARG project.
- Jessica meet with Senta Goody from DCF and as result has developed the initial primary consequence of binge drinking that FHE-ASAP will focus on. This will be sexual assaults with in a college/university community where substance abuse is prevalent.
- Jessica spoke with several of the local community coalitions about the need for uniform data collection at the Higher Education level and generally everyone supported the issue and most of the county representatives were willing to work with the Higher Education Intuitions in their areas if they had not already been doing so to further date collection on the high risk population of college students with in Florida.
- DCF also seemed open to the idea of funding the CORE on a regional basis as a beginning step to collect data on a uniform basis.
- The FHE-ASAP website has been updated to include a page for SARG updates and reference material to the DCF/FSU strategic prevention framework planning documents.

IV. Website addition, “Campus Initiatives” – Jessica Carter
