Update on BASICS – Tavis Glassman

- The needs assessment survey was sent out to FHE-ASAP members to complete. Once the survey is filled out, people will be instructed as to the next steps. Only one person from each school should complete the needs assessment. The Center College Health & Safety continues to monitor which schools completed the survey. Tavis will check with Ellen to see if this information can be released to Bob. Bob is willing to write e-mails or make phone calls to encourage schools to complete the survey.
- The next step in the BASIC's implementation will occur at the Prevention Conference's higher education day on November 16th. George Parks and Laurie Davidson will be presenting. Ellen would like the schools that are planning on attending to RSVP. Bob found out from Mike Smith that there are no mini-grant funds. After the November training, there will be a follow up training in the spring, to train the counselors who will actually be working with students. FHE-ASAP need to begin thinking about the logistics of this training. Tavis Glassman suggested that information regarding the spring training logistics should be sent out to the rest of the members. Bob can see which schools are participating and then pick a location for the schools to travel. Tavis suggested that Ellen Donoghue should be on a future call to answer questions.

Prevention Conference Update – Bob Ruday

- Chris Franzetti and Senta Goudy have met to review the schedule for the Higher Education day at the Prevention Conference. There can't be concurrent sessions during the opening session on Wednesday morning. There is time for one session in the morning, two sessions in the afternoon, and the BASICS session can be extended until 6:00 p.m. It was discussed that people could spend the night if there was any mini-grant money.
- Tom Hall suggested having a clinical and an administrative tract, in which the BASICS training would be part of the administrative tract. Chris will put together a draft of the two different schedules; one schedule of Wednesday as the full day and another schedule of Wednesday as the administrative tract and Thursday as the clinical tract. Laurie Davidson, George Parks, Beth DeRicco, Kim Novak, and Peter Lake are all confirmed as speakers for November 16th. FSU's Vice President will be attending. UF and UCF are hoping to invite their Vice Presidents. The registration fee for the conference is \$150.

FHE's Participating in the FADAAA August Conference – Tom Hall

- Tom Hall presented at the FADAAA conference in August. Senta's perception is that there was good feedback about having a session on higher education. Tom will send the power point presentation to Chris Franzetti. Tom has offered to bring ABT representatives, as well as a representative from the Orange County Coalition to talk about their collaborative efforts, for a Friday morning session. Tavis asked if FHE-ASAP would be administering the CORE survey again this fall. Tom said that UCF will be administering the CORE in October, but he has not heard anything from the coalition.
- Senta Goudy provided an update regarding the prevention roundtable on advocacy started earlier in the year. They have finished the first draft of a keg registration paper. They are hoping to include this on the legislative agenda. They are working with MADD to get sponsors and co-sponsors to help pass the bill. Senta can send this draft to Bob for him to forward to everyone. Tavis shared that Gainesville is seriously consider adopting a keg registration policy at the local level. Senta also shared that National MADD is relocating their state office to Tampa-they are looking at more fund-raising possibilities. MADD is focusing on several policies this year including keg registration and house parties. Ellen Snelling and the roundtable group will examine the feasibility of developing a keg registration policy and drafting a paper on this issue.

Parent's Brochure – Hope Johnson

- Hope provided an update on the school's participating in the Parent brochure. Most schools have finished theirs. UF is still waiting on getting an image from their graphic artist to submit to Trish at FSU.

OJJDP Conference – Maureen Miller & Tavis Glassman

- Tavis and Maureen attended the Underage Drinking Enforcement Training Center and OJJDP National Leadership Conference in Tucson, Arizona from August 18th-21st. They also had submitted a presentation proposal and were accepted. They had the opportunity to attend great sessions. Ohio Parents for Drug Free Youth have a program for parents who host house parties where alcohol is served ("Parents Who Host, Lose the Most). New Hampshire has a statewide social marketing campaign entitled Buyer Beware, which explains the consequences for those who buy alcohol for minors. Tavis and Maureen presented on UF's efforts to reduce high risk drinking in Gainesville, which highlight support from senior administration.

Miscellaneous – Ellen Snelling

- MADD is looking to increase the penalties for parents hosting house parties.
