I. Demographics

- *Public vs. Private*
 - a) Public – 44%
 - b) Private – 56%
- *Community College vs. 4-year Institution*
 - a) Community College – 6%
 - b) 4-year Institution – 94%
- *Rural vs. Urban*
 - a) Rural – 12.5%
 - b) Urban – 87.5%
- *Population*
 - a) under 5,000 students – 31.3%
 - b) 5,000-8,000 students – 6.3%
 - c) 10,000-15,000 students – 25%
 - d) over 20,000 students – 37.5%
- *ATOD Staff*
 - a) 75% of those who completed the survey have an ATOD staff member
 - b) 56.3% of those who completed the survey stated they do NOT have more than one person assigned to ATOD issues
 - c) 56.3% of those who completed the survey stated that the ATOD staff member has multiple roles on campus and is not solely focused on ATOD prevention issues.

II. Website

- Current visits to website:
 - a) Rarely – 56.3%
 - b) 1-3 per month – 43.8%
- 62.5 % - would be more likely to visit the FHE-ASAP website if it contained more data/program resources and was more user friendly

III. Adult Binge Drinking (18-25 year olds)

- 80% of those who completed the survey utilize a program to address Adult Binge Drinking
 - a) of the 80% above – 85% use an evidence based program implemented with a fidelity model/best practices method
 - b) of the 80% above – 54% use pre and post test to evaluate the effectiveness of the program
- Funding of Program:
 - a) 69% of the programs are funded with an institutional budge allotment
 - b) 31% of the programs are funded solely on grants provided by the federal or state government and/or private donations
- Community Partnerships:
 - a) of the 80% above – 67% have partnered with their community coalitions/community partners with regard to Adult Binge Drinking

IV. Situational Violence (including physical and sexual assaults)

- 69% of those who completed the survey utilize a program to address Situational Violence
 - a) of the 69% above – 10% use an evidence based program implemented with a fidelity model/best practices method
 - b) of the 69% above – 10% use pre and post test to evaluate the effectiveness of the program
 - c) of the 69% above – 10% feel the program has changed behaviors on campus
- Funding of Program:
 - a) 80% of the programs are funded with an institutional budget allotment
- Community Partnerships:
 - a) of the 69% above – 10% have partnered with their community coalitions/community partners with regard to Situational Violence

V. Retail Access (includes proximity of establishment to campus)

- 39% of those who completed the survey utilize programs to address Retail Access within their campus community/neighborhoods
 - a) of the 39% above – 33% utilize an institutional policy
 - b) of the 39% above – 33% rely on local ordinances to address Retail Access within their campus community/neighborhood
- Community Partnerships:
 - a) of the 39% above – 57% have partnered with their community coalitions/community partners with regard to Retail Access policies and ordinances

VI. Promotions/Price Specials of Alcohol

- 38% of those who completed the survey utilizes policies with regard to promotion on campus
 - a) of the 38% above – 71% have an institutional policy enforce
 - b) of the 38% above – 16% have implemented the policy according to best practices
 - c) of the 38% above – 16% feel that a change in behavior has occurred
 - d) of the 38% above – 0% utilize pre and post tests to evaluate the policy
- Funding of Program:
 - a) 40% of the policies/enforcement are supported with institutional budget allotments
- Community Partnerships:
 - a) of the 38% above – 33% have partnered with their community coalitions/community partners with regard to Promotions/Price Specials of Alcohol

VII. Social Norms/College Norms

- 69% of those who completed the survey utilize programs with regard to Social/College Norms
 - a) of the 69% above – 40% use evidence based programs implemented with fidelity/best practices
 - b) of the 69% above – 40% use pre and post tests to evaluate the programs effectiveness
 - c) of the 69% above – 10% feel a change in behavior has occurred
- Funding of Program:
 - a) 50% of the programs are supported with institutional budget allotments
 - b) 50% are supported solely by federal or state grants and/or private donations

- Community Partnerships:
 - a) of the above 69% - 50% have partnered with their community coalitions/community partners with regard to Social Norms

VIII. Institutional Alcohol Policy

- 100 % of those who completed the survey have an alcohol policy enforce
 - a) of the 100% above – 62 % have implemented the policy with best practices
 - b) of the 100% above – 62 % use pre and post tests to evaluate the policies effectiveness
 - c) of the 100 % above – 23% feel a change in behavior has occurred
- Funding of Program:
 - a) 83 % of the programs are supported with institutional budget allotments
- Community Partnerships:
 - a) of the above 100% - 33% have partnered with their community coalitions/community partners with regard to alcohol policies
 - b) of the above 100% - 54 % of the polices extend to off campus violations
